Rick Opton's love of health and fitness led him to purchasing a failing health club in Juno Beach in 2005. Since then, he has grown Log-

gerhead Fitness from 400 active members to over 1,800. Today Loggerhead Fitness has a stellar reputation in our community and in 2014 was awarded 'Small Business of the

'Year' by the Palm Beach North Chamber of Commerce. In an annual contest sponsored by the Palm Beach Post, Loggerhead Fitness is a three-time winner (2019, 2020 and 2021) for "Best Fitness Center" in Palm Beach County.

Q. What makes your job rewarding?

A. The people who come to work out at our center! Also, what is very rewarding are all the things we're able to do here, to offer this club as a platform to service our community.

Q. What do you see for the future of Loggerhead Fitness?

A. I want to grow our community involvement; I'd like to see Loggerhead serving our residents in more ways than as a clean, nice place to get healthy. I'd like to be the venue for more events and speakers. Right now, 70% of our members are between the ages of 55 and 90, so I would like to expand our memberships to more millennials in our area. And of course, I want to continue to spread our message that fitness is good for every aspect of our lives.

Q. What about the uncertainties of developers coming and going, how does that affect you?

A. So, in terms of the Plaza La Mer, it did just get sold. There are new owners, the Bucksbaum Properties out of Chicago. I have talked with the Bucksbaum; they are moving forward with us on a 5-year lease renewal. They're going to be probably making it nicer, refurbing it. They're going to fill some of the empty vacant spots, suites that are here.

Q. You've got the Caretta project on the corner of US 1 with 96 condos starting to break ground soon. How do you feel about all these changes?

A. Well, you have that project and what's called the Christmas tree patch across the street to be developed as well. They also need amenities for these new people. Where are they going to go eat? Where are they going to go work out? If they don't come here to work out, they're not going across the drawbridge. Nobody wants to do that. I think we'll become even more important to this community because of these changes.

Q. Any last words?

A. Come and work out with us at Loggerhead Fitness! We have something for everyone!
